'Thank you so much for the invitation. It sounds absolutely what we need!! I am so depressed as I go into schools and see what FT has become.

My final year students, when on placement in schools, have carried out various pieces of research into food teaching for their final dissertations and the confusion, non existent subject CPD and poor lesson content is the norm - especially at KS3.

It doesn't need to be like this.

When my FT PGCE did not run for one year in 2012 I contacted approx 200 interested parties and organisations in order to highlight the problem from a training point of view. From the BBC to the chairman of Liverpool FC, there could not have been less interest. I wrote a sample letter to my MP and e mailed it to 70 food teachers for them to modify and send on to theirs. From celebrity chefs and TV personalities who talked the talk on panels and phone ins, I contacted them all. Eventually I stopped - it's not something to be done alone! '
